

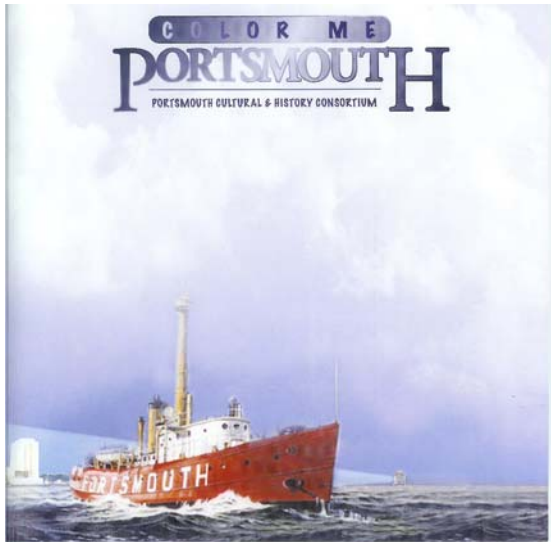

PARTNERSHIP CO-SPONSORS *COLOR ME PORTSMOUTH*

The Portsmouth Partnership, the Portsmouth Schools Foundation and Portsmouth Public Schools have teamed up to cover the cost of this year's "*Color Me Portsmouth*" coloring book, distributed each year to second graders in the Portsmouth Public School System.

The SOL-compliant coloring book project is an example of the Portsmouth Cultural and Historical Consortium's successful partnerships with its member organizations. With content overseen by members of the Consortium, the book features drawings by students from the city's High Schools, with outer covers and

layout design provided by students from TCC's Visual Arts Center. Twenty-three pages of captioned drawings depict such historical sites as the 1846 Courthouse, the Court Street Library, the Emanuel AME Church, Trinity Episcopal Church and Chevra T'helim Synagogue; historical figures such as Colonel Crawford, I.C. Norcom and Jeffrey T. Wilson; and maps depicting Portsmouth's growth through the years as well as its school sites. Twenty-four word clues are hidden in a historical word search puzzle, and detailed descriptions of each page's drawings are provided at the end of the book.

"*Color Me Portsmouth*" brings Portsmouth's history to life as it brings Portsmouth's history to its children.
